



MESSAGE FROM YOUR ADHA 2nd Delegate



NDHA delegation team is enjoying a little break before we begin preparation for House of Delegates (HOD) 2024. I began my journey to the ADHA 2nd Delegate position as an intern for NDHA. In January of 2023, I joined the board to help organize vendors at the Annual Session. I enjoyed my time with NDHA so much that, with some encouragement from board members, I chose to join the delegation team. It has been a very eye-opening and wonderful learning experience. I would like to provide a quick update about some of the newly adopted proposed resolutions, proposed by-laws and also wanted to give a look at what it is that the ADHA delegation does.

Throughout the year, there are submissions to ADHA regarding changes that members, groups, or sometimes even a state propose. It is the delegates' job to review and discuss each one of the proposals. Some are easy to adopt or reject, others require a lot of discussion and amending. Although this is a gross simplification of the process, it gives you a general idea. NDHA delegates are part of District VIII and meet with our district once, sometimes 2-3 times a month to prepare for HOD. In these meetings we discuss our thoughts and concerns about each of the proposals. As HOD draws closer, delegates can submit testimony for the proposals they wish.

During HOD, each state's delegation team meets and goes through discussions about the proposals, and eventually vote on each one. The delegation also votes on the incoming ADHA board members. To take part in something like this was not only a first, but an incredible experience. I was able to listen to so many people who are so passionate about the dental hygiene profession. It really was nothing I could have expected.

One of the biggest topics of conversation during delegate meetings and at HOD was a group of proposals suggesting a reconfiguration of the ADHA board. This was not a new topic; it is something that has been discussed in previous HOD but was not able to be adopted. The ADHA board members talked about a decline in membership as well as discussions about how we can rebuild ADHA membership. This is not something we are experiencing alone in Nebraska; it is a problem on a national level as well. While many people agreed that a restructuring could be beneficial and it continues to be proposed to the HOD, there is concern that there is not enough bandwidth to make it happen at this time.

Another significant discussion was the dissolution of the Nominating Committee. The purpose of the Nominating Committee was to vet and slate candidates for ADHA board nomination each year. During HOD candidates can either be slated from the Nominating Committee or run from the floor. After a lengthy discussion, it was decided to adopt the dissolution of the Nominating Committee. Moving forward, all candidates for future ADHA board positions will run from the floor, there will be no prior vetting and slating of candidates.

These are just a few of the many proposals discussed during HOD. In just a few short months, NDHA delegation team will be reading through the 2024 HOD manual. Any guesses on how many pages there will be this year?

Board of Dentistry Update

At the October 13th Board of Dentistry meeting, the Board voted to approve the expanded function course Restorative 1 and 2, now offered through the University of Nebraska College of Dentistry. This course prepares Dental Assistants and Dental Hygienists to perform expanded functions and place direct restorations using composite, amalgam and glass ionomer materials for Class I, V and VI, and Class II, III and IV and complex restorations. Fifteen-hundred hours of chairside experience is required to enroll in this course.

On November 9th, 2023 the Nebraska Board of Dentistry called an emergency meeting regarding the negative impact of the state's limited acceptance of dental clinical examinations. Currently, by statute, anyone seeking a dental or dental hygiene license in Nebraska must successfully complete the CRDTS exam, or one that is "comparable", which significantly limits the number of qualified candidates for the University of Nebraska's Dental Residency Program, and makes it difficult for new or experienced providers to consider making Nebraska home. During this meeting it was established that the Board could determine if another examination is acceptable for temporary licensure, as the current language reads:

"The department, with the recommendation of the Board, shall issue a temporary license to any person who a) has met the requirements for a license to practice dentistry as set forth in section 38-1117 or is licensed in another jurisdiction as defined in 38-1124 and b) is enrolled in an accredited school or college of dentistry for the purpose of completing a postgraduate or residency program in dentistry".

Previously, the Board had evaluated the ADEX exam, which is the most widely accepted exam nationally, and determined it to be incomparable to CRDTS, thus not acceptable for licensure in the state. At this meeting the Board voted to revise recommendations "solely" for temporary licensure and deem the ADEX exam comparable to CRDTS, but only for the purpose of temporary licensure.

2024 Legislative Session

The Nebraska Legislature's short session begins January 3rd. We anticipate Senator Carol Blood's primary Bill will be one to enact the Dentist and Dental Hygienist Compact, which aims to increase license portability. Last year, NDHA participated in the Council for State Governments' Legislative Summit, in Washington DC, where we learned about the intricacies and specificities of the proposed compact. We then gave testimony in support of the compact at the legislative hearing in Nebraska last September. Since then, another state has pending legislation, making the count three states that have enacted and eight states have legislation pending. Once seven states enact, the compact will take effect and licensure will be portable for licensees across the participating states, via compact privilege. State Dental Plan Update and Hearing

Starting January 1st, 2024, Nebraska Medicaid will transition from one dental benefits manager to an integrated plan with both dental and medical care provided by three MCOs. Nebraska DHHS has proposed plan amendments for dentistry as follows:

1. Remove the \$750 annual dental benefit maximum for adults
2. Incremental payment for dentures to reimburse dentists over time for each step of the process
3. Asymptomatic wisdom tooth extraction to cover the extraction of asymptomatic wisdom teeth based on the judgment of the provider
4. Services provided by Public Health Dental Hygienists will be reimbursed for more select services they provide to Medicaid members
5. Simplified credentialing starting in 2025, there will be a single website for providers to credential with all three MCOs in one application

These changes will not be effective until they complete the review process and are approved. The public hearing for the proposed changes will be held on January 22, 2024, from 1 to 3 p.m. in the Meadowlark Conference Room at 301 Centennial Mall South, Lincoln, NE 68509.

The extension of Nebraska Medicaid postpartum coverage from 60 days to 12 months begins January 1, 2024. This gives mothers the opportunity to seek dental care and improve their oral health. Improving the mother's dental microbiome can set up the child for better dental health in the future!

NDHI Update

A Behind the Scenes Look at “The Nebraska Dental Hygiene Initiative” (NDHI)

The year was 2008...the Nebraska Dental Hygienists' Association (NDHA) was pioneering some new territory in changing Nebraska law to allow hygienists to become Medicaid providers and receive reimbursement for various preventive procedures. A visionary group of Legislative Committee Members set some high goals for advancement in the public health arena. Rural communities were lacking dental services. Dentists were populated in larger cities and their schedules were full with paying clients. Very few were taking new Medicaid clients. NDHA knew one of the best answers to the dental shortage was to utilize the knowledge and skill base of dental hygienists...especially the public health hygienist. In an effort to encourage dental hygienists to reach the underserved population, the NDHI was formed with the purpose of creating opportunities for dental hygienists through scholarships and service.

The NDHI is comprised of an Executive Director and 5 Directors . Three of the Directors serve as NDHA Officers: The Past President, Treasurer and Scholarship Chair. The other two Directors are Dental Hygienists and 1 of those 2 Dental Hygienists must hold a Public Health Permit. Annette Byman serves as Executive Director with Jess Bolter, Vanessa Crookshank, Marjean Stamm, Julie Niles and Kathi Narlock serving as Directors. Meetings are held throughout the year with the main emphasis on fundraising and allocating grant funds to dental hygienists who have applied for and succeeded in receiving grants to further their business plan and allocating scholarship funds to dental hygiene students.

\$750.00 in Scholarship Funds are distributed once every 2 years to one student (1st year or 2nd year) who attends UNMC, CCC or IWCC dental hygiene program. The same amount is distributed on the off year to a public health hygienist who has formed his/her own public health business. Applications open in the fall of each year with an application deadline of February. Contact NDHA at (402) 641-1319 to obtain application information.


